On October 10, 2018, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors voted 4 to 0 to approve the new McClellan-Palomar D-III Aircraft Master Plan. At that meeting, Carlsbad Mayor Matt Hall reported that Carlsbad has not yet decided to support the new CRQ Master Plan. BUT, and this is a big BUT, Mayor Hall elected to submit his request to speak on a Green, "IN FAVOR" speaker card and NOT the Pink "IN OPPOSITION" card. This action, along with Supervisor Horn's thanking Mayor Hall for his comments, can be construed as Mayor Hall subliminally giving the Board the "Green Light" to vote as they did. On October 16, 2018, during the Carlsbad City Council Meeting, a motion was made to add to a future agenda a discussion on whether or not the Council supported the expansion of CRQ. During that meeting Mayor Hall chastised (with what appeared to be a well rehearsed speech) chastised the City Council for considering such a request and other discussions on CRQ.

Unbelievable and There's So Much More!

On October 18, 2018, Mayor Hall was interviewed by San Diego Union Editorial reporters. In that interview he stated that he had been working on the airport issue since 2010.

In June 2013, KPBS reported Mayor Hall stated *"Sound of Money"*, as jets were landing on the runway at a gathering to support the airport expansion by the business community.

In September 2014, in the State of the City Address Q&A session, Mayor Hall was asked for his position on the airport runway extension.

~ His answer was - *It's not a big deal.* ~

After the October 16 and 26 Carlsbad City Council meetings, it is now painfully clear as the Buffalo Springfield song lyrics state, ♪ *There is something happening here, what it is ain't exactly clear.*♪ But the October 26th, 3 to 2 vote, is hopefully signaling that the Council recognizes what the Carlsbad citizens have known for years ... that something is wrong when it comes to Carlsbad City protecting its citizens against the CRQ expansion. Only time will tell.

For the last five years or more, the City Council members have refused to take a position when they were asked if they supported the County's planned CRQ expansion. The latest example WAS the October 16, 2018 City Council meeting. As described previously, a motion was made to have a discussion during a future Council meeting about whether or not the Council supported the proposed County CRQ expansion plan. That motion was voted down 4 to 1.

Furthermore, in the same October 16 meeting, Councilmember Michael Schumacher (no relationship to Cori Schumacher) chose to comment on what one public speaker said. M. Schumacher considered the statements about Mayor Hall's action in the October 10 Board of Supervisors (BOS) meeting to be false; however, in reality the public speaker statement was correct. That said, M. Schumacher did choose to ignore statements made by public speakers in support of the expansion that he knew to be false; for example, the airport noise is getting quieter not louder, a fact that M. Schumacher knows to be false.

Furthermore, Councilmember M. Schumacher stated in his chastising of the public speaker, that Mayor Hall did exactly what we ALL agreed he should do. So what exactly is it they all agreed to do? It definitely was not to challenge the County CRQ Master Plan and protect ALL OF Carlsbad's 114,000 citizens' health, quality of life and property values. Hopefully this time with the October 23, 2018 three to two (3 to 2) vote – *"Actions always prove why words mean nothing."*

If so, today's Council will finally not be allowed to ignore history and the law. In 1980, [Ordinance 21.53.015](#) and [Conditional Use Permit \(CUP\) 172](#) were championed by Councilmember Bud Lewis and agreed to by the County. CUP 172 specifically lists what can be done within the boundaries of the airport without requiring Carlsbad's and citizens' approval. The runway is not listed as something that can be modified. Additionally, the CA Public Utility Code states a runway extension is an airport expansion. BOTTOM LINE, the City Council is well aware of these facts and refuses to honestly discuss the facts and take action to protect Carlsbad's citizens.
